Basic introduction to the rules and protection of
your personal data

Dear business partners,

On 25 May 2018, the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 GDPR comes into force, which brings clearer rules for the processing of data of natural persons. We believe that this regulation is primarily intended to protect us as fellow citizens and our privacy.

To comply with the GDPR, we have written out these rules, which we follow and expect our business partners to follow as well.

How we protect your data and details

We do our best to maximize the protection of your personal data. We consider the main factors to be human, legal and technological, which are described below.

Human protection

We are a team of professional consultants and project managers who are fully aware of the possible consequences of information leaks, and we view confidentiality as a matter of course. We all collect, process and store data only to the minimum extent necessary to perform our tasks, and we do it with the utmost prudence. All data protection incidents are reported to the responsible person who addresses them with the appropriate authority.

Technological protection

Nowadays, technology and its misuse pose a significant risk to data of any nature. As part of technology protection, we use password protection, firewall, antivirus and other standard data protection tools on all devices. We never leave the devices unattended outside of locked areas. As storage for your data, we use tools from Google and Wrike which also recognize GDPR and are technologically and legally prepared for it. We do not automatically process your personal data in any way.

Legal protection

We have signed confidentiality and non-disclosure agreements with our customers and suppliers. We consider the data of natural persons to be particularly confidential. In all cases, the legal agreements provide for compensation for damages, including contractual penalties.

What your rights are

The GDPR clearly specifies your rights which you can enforce contacting the above mentioned responsible person. The most important ones are the following.

Right to erasure (right to be forgotten)

Your personal data will be erased except for data necessary for the performance of a legal obligation, data necessary for the defense of legal claims or data necessary for the protection of public interests.

Right of access (familiarization with the data we hold about you)

On your request, you may be given access to the personal data we process about you. You will be provided with a copy of all personal data we hold about you with the exception of our intellectual property or our business secrets and also cases where personal data of others may be transferred.

Right to object to personal data processing

You may object at any time, which will be dealt with in an appropriate manner so as not to prejudice your interests.

Right to personal data portability

If you have provided us with your personal data on the basis of a contract or consent, your personal data will be exported to you in a structured, commonly used electronic format, so that you can transfer it to a third party.

Right to update your personal data, so that an out-of-date version does not cause you harm

We will ensure that your personal data is updated upon your initiative.
